

**Amended Ordinance for the Use, Protection, Regulation and Control
of the Property of the
Jackson County Parks and Recreation Commission**

**Chapter I
Short Title and Citation**

This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the “Jackson County Parks and Recreation Commission Ordinance”.

**Chapter II
Construction of Words and Definitions**

Section 1: Construction of Words

Whenever this Ordinance shall use any word, importing the plural number, describing, or referring to, any matters, parties, or persons, any single matter, party or person shall also be included although distributive words are not used.

Likewise, whenever this Ordinance shall refer to any subject matter, party, or person, by words importing the singular number or the masculine gender only, several matters, parties, or persons female as well as male and bodies corporate, shall also be included although distributive words are not used.

Section 2: Definitions

- A. “Commission” means the Jackson County Parks and Recreation Commission.
- B. “Commission Property” means all lands, waters and property administered by, or under the jurisdiction of, the Jackson County Parks and Recreation Commission.
- C. “Camping” means the overnight lodging or sleeping of persons on the ground or in any other manner, or in any sleeping bag, tent, trailer-tent, trailer coach, vehicle camper, or in any other conveyance erected, parked or placed on the premises or waters within any park or recreation area administered by the Jackson County Parks and Recreation Commission.

- D. “Camp” means the use, or intended use, of any device, shelter, or equipment, for the purpose of sleeping or shelter during the hours of 10 p.m. and 8 a.m.
- E. “Director” means the Director of the Jackson County Parks and Recreation Commission or his authorized agent.
- F. “Permission” or “Permit” means “written permission” or “written permit” in the actual physical possession of the person to whom the Director has given or granted the “Permission” or “Permit”.
- G. “Waters” means waters within the jurisdiction of the Commission.
- H. “Employee” means any full or part-time, regular or temporary, worker in the employ of the Commission under the supervision of the Director.
- I. “Watercraft” means any device of conveyance on the water or ice, whether propelled by motor, engine, wind, or human power.
- J. “Vehicle” means any device of conveyance on land, whether propelled by motor, engine, wind, or human power.
- K. “Sound and Energy Amplification” means music, speech, or any sound or noise transmitted by artificial means, including, but not limited to, amplifiers, loudspeakers, radios or any similar devices, or lights, rays, lenses, mirrors or laser beams or the like.
- L. “Amusement Contraptions” means any contrivance, device, gadget, machine or structure designed to test the skill or strength of the user, or to provide the user with any sort of ride, lift, swing or fall experience, including, but not limited to, ball-throwing contest devices, pinball-type devices, animal ride devices, ball and hammer devices, trampoline devices, or the like.
- M. “Area” means any specified place within the property of the Commission.
- N. “Property” means any lands, waters, facilities, or possessions of the Commission.
- O. “Written Permission of the Director” means written permission granted by the Director or his authorized agents.
- P. “Posted” means that a notice is posted at a location designated by the Director or his authorized agents.

Chapter III

Public Use, Permits, and Hours

Section 1: Public Use

Any group or gathering of twenty-five (25) or more persons, may use certain areas within the Commission Property, to the exclusion of others, only after written application to, and with the permission of, the Director.

Section 2: Permits

- A. The Director shall determine the manner in which a written application for a permit for reserved areas shall be made, and the permissible uses of Commission Property.
- B. Each application shall include a deposit of Fifty (\$50) Dollars. This deposit will cover the cost of the inspection and the cleaning of the area by Commission employees upon completion of the use. Upon inspection of the property by a Commission employee, if the area is clean of debris, the Commission will return the deposit within forty-eight (48) hours of the inspection. If the area is not clean of debris, the deposit is forfeited to the Commission to cover the cost of inspection and cleaning. The determination of the Director as to the condition of the area upon completion of the use shall be final.
- C. Each application shall be made at least seven (7) days in advance of the time and date requested. The reservation shall be posted at the site reserved.
- D. In the event that the number of applications for reserved areas exceeds the space available, the Director shall consider the applications in the chronological order received.
- E. Anyone granted a permit for the exclusive use of a reserved area shall comply with this Ordinance.
- F. A permit is not transferable.

Section 3.: Hours of Use

No person shall remain upon Commission Property between the hours of 10 p.m. and 8 a.m. without the permission of the Director, except at designated fishing or camp sites, and

except during the operating hours of the Cascade Falls and Park, or as otherwise designated.

Chapter IV
Protection of Property, Structures, and Natural Resources

Section 1: Destruction or Misuse of Property and Structures

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission:

- A. Wilfully destroy, deface, paint, alter, change or remove any monument, stone marker, bench mark, stake, post or blaze, marking or designating any boundary line, survey line or reference point;
- B. Wilfully cut, break, mark upon or otherwise damage, destroy or remove any post, building, equipment, wall, shelter, picnic table, bridge, pier, drain, well, fountain, pump, telephone, lamp post, fence, gate, hedge, refuse container, exhibit, display, tool storage box, utility outlet, movie screen, flagpole, flag, or any structure or any parts thereof, without the permission of the Director;
- C. Wilfully deface, destroy, cover, damage or remove any placard, notice or sign, or parts thereof, whether permanent or temporary, posted or exhibited by the Commission;
- D. Wilfully take, appropriate, excavate, injure, destroy or remove any historical or pre-historical ruin or parts thereof, or any object of antiquity, without the permission of the Director;
- E. Throw, carry, cast, drag, push or deposit any refuse container, picnic table, barricade or any other movable or non-movable property into any lake, pond, slough, stream or lagoon or upon the frozen waters thereof or to otherwise move, stack or hide such property in such a way as to render it unavailable to the general public for its intended use, to cause a hazard to public safety or to damage or destroy such property;
- F. Misuse any refuse container or receptacle by depositing into it any hot coals or other hot or burning substances, or by depositing into it any garbage, trash, refuse or other unwanted material that was not generated on the site in the course of normal, lawful use of the facility;
- G. Violate MCL 324.73102; MSA 13A17102 (recreational or trapping use on another's property);

- H. Violate MCL 324.73103; MSA 13A.17103 (discharging firearm near another's property);
- I. Violate MCL 324.73104; MSA 13A.17104 (sign tampering);
- J. Violate MCL 324.73105; MSA 13A.17105 (posting signs; enclosing another's property);
- K. Mark or post handbills on, or in any manner mar any public building walls, or any fence, tree, or pole.

Section 2: Destruction or Misuse of Natural Resources

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission:

- A. Wilfully cut, remove, uproot or destroy:
 - 1) any tree, sapling, seedling, bush, shrub, flower, plant or mushroom, whether alive or dead, or
 - 2) chip, blaze, box, girdle, trim or otherwise deface or injure any tree, shrub, or bush, or
 - 3) break or remove any branch or foliage thereof or pick or gather any seed of any tree or other plant without the permission of the Director;
- B. Wilfully remove, or cause to be removed, any sod, earth, humus, downed timber, wood chips, peat, rock, sand or gravel, or remove, or cause to be removed, any other natural material of the forest floor or earth without the permission of the Director.

Section 3: Destruction by or Misuse of Fire

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission:

- A. Wilfully set fire, or cause to be set on fire, any tree, forest, woodland, brush land, grassland, meadow, prairie, marsh, slash, refuse, refuse container or structure;
- B. Wilfully build a fire anywhere, for any purpose, except in provided fireplaces or receptacles approved by the Director;
- C. Leave any fire unattended for any reason;
- D. Wilfully drop, throw or otherwise scatter lighted matches, burning cigars, cigarettes, tobacco paper or other inflammable material.

Section 4: Contraband

All plants, trees, flora, fauna, or parts thereof, in possession contrary to this Chapter, shall be, and are hereby declared, contraband, and, as such, shall be subject to seizure by the Director, any employee, or by any duly sworn peace officer.

Chapter V Protection of Wildlife

Section 1: Animals and Birds

Upon the property of the commission, no person shall hunt, trap, catch, wound, kill, pursue, molest, or poison, or attempt to hunt, trap, catch, wound, kill, pursue, molest, or poison, any bird or animal, disturb, molest or rob any nest of any bird or the lair, den or burrow, of any animal, without the permission of the Director.

Section 2: Water Fowl Hunting

The Commission or the Director may designate limited areas in which water fowl hunting will be permitted.

Section 3: Fishing

The Commission or the Director may permit fishing, in accordance with the laws of the State of Michigan and the rules of the Department of Natural Resources, in areas designated for fishing.

Section 4: Contraband

All game, animals, fowl, birds, fish and other aquatic life hunted, killed, taken or destroyed, bought, sold, battered, or in possession, contrary to this Chapter, shall be, and is declared contraband, and the same shall be subject to seizure and confiscation by the Director or any employee, who shall turn the same over to the Michigan Department of Natural Resources for disposal.

Chapter VI
Regulation of Sports, Games, Activities and Other Uses

Section 1: Swimming, Bathing and Wading

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission:

- A. Swim, bathe, or wade, between sunset and sunrise, in any of the watercourses, lakes, ponds, or sloughs;
- B. Swim, bathe, or wade in any of the watercourses, lakes, ponds, or sloughs, except at such times and places as designated by the Commission or the Director;
- C. Carry, or have in his possession, any glass or metal container on any beach or in the water adjacent thereto.

Section 2: Watercraft

- A. No person shall bring into, attempt to launch or use, or navigate any boat, yacht, canoe, raft or other watercraft upon, the waters of any watercourse, lagoon, lake, pond, ice or slough, upon the property of the Commission, except at such times or places designated by the Commission or the Director for such purposes.
- B. All watercraft shall comply with, and be used in compliance with, Public Act 303 of the Public Acts of the State of Michigan of 1967, as amended, and such regulations as may be adopted under the authority of that Act, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part of this Ordinance.
- C. Air mattresses, inner tubes, and other inflatable devices are restricted to designated beaches.
- D. All provisions MCL of 324.80101; MSA 13A.80101, through MCL 324.80172; MSA 13A.80172 (marine safety) are incorporated into this Ordinance and are to be complied with.
- E. All provisions of MCL 281.1401, et seq.; MSA 9.205(1), et seq., (Personal Watercraft Safety Act) are incorporated into this Ordinance and are to be complied with.

Section 3: Engine-Powered Models or Toys

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission, start, fly, or use any fuel-powered engine or jet-type or electric-powered model aircraft, boat, or rocket, or like-powered toy or model, except at those areas designated or posted by the Commission or the Director for such use, in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the Commission.

Section 4: Aviation

No person shall, upon the property of the commission, make or ascent in a balloon, aircraft, airplane, glider, hang glider or kite, or make any descent in or from any balloon, aircraft, airplane, parachute, glide, hang glider, or kite, without the permission of the Commission or the Director.

Section 5: Horseback Riding

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission, ride any horse on any driveway, roadway, path or trail, without the permission of the Commission or the Director.

Section 6: Bicycling

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission:

- A. Fail to ride a bicycle as closely as possible to the right-hand side of any road, trail or path, as conditions permit;
- B. Carry another person on the handlebars, frame or fender, or so ride on a bicycle except on a suitable seat attached to such bicycle for such purpose, or operate a bicycle in a reckless manner so as to endanger pedestrians;
- C. Ride a bicycle on any path or trail more than two abreast or on any roadway or road used by the public for regular motor vehicle access in any other manner than single file.
- D. Ride any bicycle between sunset and sunrise without the proper safety equipment.

Section 7: Sound or Energy Amplification

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission:

- A. Play or operate any sound amplification device, including public address systems, amplified musical instruments and the like, or operate any other energy amplification device without the permission of the Commission or the Director. Any such playing or amplification may not be at a volume or in a manner that annoys or disturbs the quiet, comfort or repose of persons in the vicinity.
- B. Sound any horn or signal device on any vehicle for any reason other than as a signal responding to an imminent danger (as an immediate safety measure) (1) for any unnecessary or unreasonable duration or (2) unreasonably loudly or harshly.
- C. Keep any animal or bird which causes frequent or loud continued noise that disturbs the comfort or repose of any persons in the vicinity. A person “keeps” any animal if he or she (1) has a property right in it, (2) has it in his care, custody, or control, or (3) permits it to remain on his or her premises.
- D. Intentionally squeals any motor vehicle’s tires.

Section 8: Winter Sports

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission:

- A. Sled, toboggan, ski or slide on any area unless posted by the Director as “open”;
- B. Enter on or upon any frozen waters to skate, fish, slide or walk or for any purpose whatsoever upon such waters unless posted by the Director as or “open”;
- C. Fish through the ice on any frozen waters or parts thereof designated by the Commission or the Director as ice-skating areas;
- D. Bring onto or upon the frozen waters of any lake, pond or watercourse any iceboat, any motor, or wind-driven-like device or other device, without the permission of the Commission or the Director.

Section 9: Field and Team Sports

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission, play or engage in any team sport or game such as, but not limited to, baseball, football, soccer, field hockey, volleyball, lacrosse or horseshoes, except in those areas designated by the Commission or the Director.

Section 10: Amusement Contraptions and Laser Pointers

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission, bring in, set up, construct, manage or operate any amusement or entertainment contraption, device, or gadget, including laser pointers (except that area inside the Cascades Manor House used for meetings) without the permission of the Commission or the Director.

Section 11: Gambling

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission, engage in gambling of any kind.

Section 12: Camping

- A. No person shall camp upon the property of the Commission except such areas designated for camping by the Commission or the Director or without the permission of the Director.
- B. The Director may not issue a camping permit for a continuous period exceeding seven (7) nights. The Director may not renew a camping permit until twenty-four (24) hours have elapsed since the termination of the previous permit. Periods in excess of the above time limitations may be granted in the sole discretion of the Director.
- C. It is unlawful:
 - 1) For more than one family to occupy an individual camp site.
 - 2) For more than two vehicles, two tents or one house trailer to occupy an individual camp site.
 - 3) For any person, between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m., to cause, create, or make any noise or disturbance which is a hindrance to the peace, quiet and tranquility of the camping area.
 - 4) For any person to wash dishes at pumps or drinking fountains, to fail to clean camp sites daily, or to discharge waste waters or any other wastes, except into designated containers, drains, or dumping stations.
 - 5) To dig a trench or make any excavation on any camp site.

- 6) To occupy a camp site after check-out time on the last day allowed in the permit. Check-out time is 3:00 p.m., unless otherwise posted in the campground.
 - 7) To occupy a camp site contrary to the assignment made by the Director or the Campground Manager.
 - 8) To continuously cruise in any motor driven vehicle in, through, and around, campgrounds for the purpose of attracting or distracting any person using a camp site.
- D. Each camper and vehicle must be registered on the camp permit.
 - E. All visitors to a camp site must first register at the Campground Manager's Office.

Section 13: Non-Motorized Pathways

- A. Motorized Vehicles (excluding motorized wheelchairs) of any kind are prohibited.
- B. Hours of use shall be sunrise to sunset.
- C. Horses or other riding animals are prohibited from the paved portion of the Trail corridor.
- D. All hunting and trapping is prohibited on the 100 foot Trail right-of-way.
- E. No person shall act, operate, or engage in any activity along the Falling Waters Trail (or any pathway) in a careless or negligent manner likely to endanger any person or property.

Chapter VII Regulation of Motorized Vehicles, Traffic and Parking

Section 1: Parking

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission, stop stand, or park a vehicle:

- A. In any place marked as a passenger or loading zone, other than for the expeditious loading or unloading of passengers, or for the loading and unloading of materials.
- B. Upon any roadway or in any parking area in such a manner as to block, restrict or impede the normal flow of traffic.
- C. Or cause a vehicle to remain stopped, standing, or parked, after the closing hours of the

Commission.

- D. In a zone or area posted as prohibited parking.
- E. On turf, meadow, prairie, marsh, field, any lawn or grass, in a woodland or on the exposed roots of any tree or shrub.
- F. Violate MCL 257.675; MSA 9.2375 (Handicap Parking).

Section 2: Vehicle Operation

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission, operate or cause to be operated:

- A. Any motorized vehicle that does not comply with, or in a manner that does not comply with, the Motor Vehicle Code of the State of Michigan or any other law that deals with the equipment, control, licensing, registering and use of motorized vehicles and/or the licensing of the operators of such vehicles.
- B. A motor-driven vehicle of any kind or nature except on roads, drives or designated parking areas.
- C. A motor-driven vehicle on any park road at a speed greater than the posted speed limit or, in the absence of a posted speed limit, at a speed in excess of fifteen (15) miles per hour.
- D. Any motor-driven sled, toboggan or snowmobile except where permitted by the Commission or the Director.
- E. In such a manner as to fail to yield the right-of-way to pedestrians and equestrians.

Section 3: Off-Road Recreation Vehicles

All provision of MCL 324.81101; MSA 13A.81101, through MCL 324.81150; MSA 13A.81150, are incorporated into this ordinance and are to be complied with.

Chapter VIII Regulation of Personal Conduct and Behavior

Section 1: Vending and Advertising

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission:

- A. Expose, or offer for sale, to the general public, any articles or things, or conduct or solicit

any business, trade or occupation or profession without the permission of the Director.

- B. Display, distribute, post or fix any placard, sign, handbill, pamphlet, circular or any other writing or printed material or objects containing advertising matter or announcements of any kind whatsoever, without the permission of the Director, except that a person with a valid picnic, camping, or special event permit, may display signs to identify the location of the event or direct others to it, provided that such signs are temporary, are removed by the person at the termination of the event, are no larger than 18"x24" and are not attached to any tree or shrub or any post, building, sign, gate or structure.

Section 2. Unlawful Obstruction

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission, by force, threats, intimidations, unlawful fencing or enclosing, or by any other unlawful means, prevent or obstruct any person from peacefully entering, leaving, or making full use of the property of the Commission.

Section 3: Use of Intoxicating Liquor

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission:

- A. Possess or consume any alcoholic beverage, unless the person is over the age of twenty-one (21) years, is officially registered at a Commission campsite, is within the designated campsite, and the quantity of the alcoholic beverage does not exceed one case of beer (24 individual cans or bottles), or two 4/5 th quart bottles of liquor, or 2 quart bottles of wine.
- B. Sell, give, or furnish alcoholic liquor to anyone under twenty-one (21), or to any drunken, intoxicated, or disorderly person. MCL 436.1703(5); MSA 18.1175(703)(5), is incorporated into this Ordinance.

Section 4: Personal Conduct

No person shall, upon the Property of the Commission:

- A. Resist, fail or refuse to obey any lawful command of, interfere with, or in any manner hinder, the Director, or any employee or agent of the Commission, in the performance of their official duties;

- B. Impersonate any employee of the Commission for any reason;
- C. Be under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a controlled substance, and either endanger directly the safety of another person or property or act in a manner that causes a public disturbance;
- D. Engage in any indecent, insulting, immoral or obscene conduct in public;
- E. Swim or bathe in public without wearing the proper apparel;
- F. Willfully enter upon the property of the Commission without lawful authority, after having been forbidden to do so by the Director, or remain upon the property of the Commission after notification to depart by the Director;
- G. Expectorate, urinate, defecate, or perform any act which creates a hazardous or deleterious condition in the public, except in such facilities provided and intended for such activities;
- H. Make or excite a disturbance;
- I. Beg in a public place from any passerby, either by words, gestures or by exhibiting a sign.
- J. Make a false report, by telephone or otherwise, to any public official which may reasonably be expected to cause the evacuation or closing of a building or place open to the public, or to knowingly make a false statement or report to a peace officer.
- K. Spit or expectorate on, at or toward another person.
- L. Molest or otherwise annoy, either by touching, word of mouth, by sign or motion, any person in any public place intending to interfere with or abuse that person or offend his or her dignity or sensibilities.
- M. Willfully destroy, damage, or in any manner deface, destroy or injure any property not his or her own.
- N. Without the owner's permission, disable, or attempt to disable, in whole or in part, any motor vehicle by any means, including but not limited to (1) (deflating the tires) or (2) placing a damaging substance in or on the motor vehicle.
- O. Disturb the peace by loud, boisterous, or vulgar conduct, works, or improper diversions.
- P. Utter any insulting or fighting words which by their very utterance directly tend to incite

an immediate breach of the peace.

- Q. Engage in any disturbance, fight, quarrel, or altercation.
- R. Engage in any indecent or obscene conduct or violate MCL 750.335a; MSA 28.567(1) (indecent exposure).
- S. Violate MCL 722.642; MSA 28.282 (minor possessing or using tobacco).
- T. Violate any controlled substances provision. MCL 333.7401, et seq; MSA 14.15(7401) et seq.

Section 5: Weapons

No person shall, at any time, bring into or upon the property of the Commission, or have in his possession, whether concealed or otherwise, any weapon including, but not limited to, a bow and arrow, slingshot, cross bow, spear or spear gun, switchblade, dirk, dagger, stiletto, sword, blackjack, billy club, bludgeon, whip, any explosive substance of any force, or any other dangerous weapon; provided that this Section shall not apply to any duly sworn peace officer while carrying out his duties, nor to any person properly hunting or target practicing in areas designated by the Director for such activities. This Section does not prohibit the lawful possession and transportation of firearms as defined by State Law.

Section 6: Fireworks

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission, fire discharge, or have in his possession, any firework or any substance of an explosive nature, without the permission of the Director.

Section 7: Littering and Pollution

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission:

- A. Discard or deposit household refuse of any kind or nature in or upon the property of the Commission or in any Commission containers;
- B. Throw, cast, lay, drop or discharge into, or leave in Commission waters, any substance, matter or thing, liquid or solid, which may or does result in the pollution of the waters;

- C. Throw, cast, lay or drop on Commission property, any litter, refuse, liquid or solid, except by placing such matter in containers provided for such purpose.

Section 8: Skating and Coasting

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission:

- A. Use roller skates or skateboards, except at such times and places designated for such purposes;
- B. Skate, sled, walk, or go upon any ice, or snowshoe or ski, except at such times and places designated for such purposes;
- C. Coast with hand sleds, bobs, carts, or other vehicles, on wheels or runners, except at such times and places designated for such purpose.

Section 9: Public Exhibition

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission, without the permission of the Director, exhibit any machine or show, or any animal, or indulge in any acrobatic exhibitions, or carry on any performance or do anything whatsoever which shall cause persons to congregate and interfere with the proper use of the property for the general public or to obstruct the passage of vehicles or persons.

Section 10: Animals and Birds

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission:

- A. Cause any animal or fowl to run at large;
- B. Bring, drive, or lead any animal, except that, with the permission of the Director, houses or other beasts and draft animals may be ridden by persons in charge thereof or driven before a vehicle attached thereto;
- C. Bring, drive, lead, or carry any dog or other animal or pet which is unleashed, or upon a lease more than six (6) feet in length, under the immediate control of a competent person, except for animals used in hunting or field trials;
- D. Suffer any dog or pet to enter any public building, or to be upon any designated beach,

- except a trained and working leader dog;
- E. Cause or permit any horse or other animal to stand on Commission property unless securely hitched or in the charge of a competent person;
 - F. Torture, ill-treat, or neglect any animal or fowl;
 - G. Hitch or tie any animal or pet to any tree, bush or shrub;
 - H. Permit any animal litter to remain upon the property;
 - I. Fail to have proof of current vaccination if a person has a dog with him at a campsite.

Section 11: Trespassing

No person shall wilfully enter upon any property of the Commission or any Commission campsite without lawful authority, after having been forbidden to do so by the Director, any Campground Manager, or any Commission employee, or remain upon any property of the Commission or any Commission campsite after notification to depart therefrom by the Director, any Campground Manager, or any Commission employee.

Chapter IX Special Permits

No person shall, upon the property of the Commission, erect, construct, or maintain, above or below the ground, across or beneath the property of the commission, anything without the permission of the Director and in the manner permitted by the Director.

The Commission or the Director may, upon written application, grant a specific permit for a special use when, in the opinion of the commission or the Director, special consideration is warranted.

Chapter X Fees and Charges

No person shall use any facility, land, or area for which the Commission or the Director have established a fee or charge without the payment of the fee or charge.

Chapter XI

Emergency Powers

This Ordinance shall not prohibit or hinder a duly authorized agent of the Commission or a peace officer from the performance of his duties.

The Commission or the Director shall establish emergency rules required to protect the health, welfare and safety of park visitors and to protect park property.

Chapter XII Enforcement and Ban

Section 1. Fines and Punishment

A person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a Misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined not more than \$500.00, plus the costs of the prosecuting and/or shall be imprisoned in the County Jail for a period not to exceed 90 days. In addition, any person violating the ban against controlled substances is subject to the forfeiture provisions of MCL 333.7521, et seq; MSA 14.15(7521), et seq.

Section 2: Ban from Property and Trespass

A person violating this Ordinance shall, in addition to the provisions of the preceding Section, be subject to immediate expulsion from Commission property, and shall be forbidden from entrance upon Commission property for a period of time not to exceed one (1) year, in the discretion of the Director.

A person violating this ban from Commission property shall be subject to criminal prosecution for trespass, and, upon conviction, shall be subject to the penalties set forth in Section 1 of this Chapter.

Section 3: Arrest Powers for Ordinance Violations

All members of the Commission Police and all duly sworn peace officers shall have the power, and are authorized, to arrest, with or without an Arrest Warrant, any person found in the act of violating this Ordinance.

Chapter XIII Amendments

The Jackson County Board of Commissions may, from time to time, amend this Ordinance by a majority vote of the Board, and the Amendment may be shown by either revising the Section amended or by attaching the Amendment to this Ordinance.

Chapter XIV
Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect when notice of the adoption of this Ordinance by the Jackson County Board of Commission is published in a newspaper of general circulation in Jackson County. The County Clerk shall file a copy of this Ordinance, with a copy of the publication attached in her office.

Jackson County Parks and Recreation Commission

Metal Detector Policy

Metal detectors will be allowed in general public areas with permission from the Parks Supervisor.

No person shall destroy or remove any historical or pre-historical ruin or parts thereof, or any object of antiquity without the permission of the Parks Director.

Metal Detectors are **NOT** allowed in the following areas at any time:

- Camping areas;
- Golf courses and driving range areas;
- Cascades Manor House grounds; and,
- Cascades Falls fenced in area.

Further, metal detectors are **NOT** allowed at any time during the staging time of any special events in any County Park.

The use of metal detectors in the water is under the direction of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources.

Enforcement and Fines

A person violating any provision of the above terms shall be guilty of a misdemeanor upon issue of a ticket, and shall be subject to immediate expulsion from Commission property, and shall be banned from entrance upon Commission property for a period of time not to exceed one (1) year, at the discretion of the Parks Director.
