<p>Healthy Community</p>	<p>Everyone has completed the system scans. The Health Action Teams are looking at the system scans to evaluate what they are doing.</p> <p>The Nutrition Action Team is working on the non-motorized walkway, street scape exercise friendly programs. Working with Sparton Performance Program which is a youth health and wellness program. Smoke free action team is working with the reassignment of resources at the state level for smoking cessation. They are expecting to receive regional money. Teen pregnancy prevention program is going well. They are going after additional abstinence funding of \$50,000.</p>	<p>Upcoming HIOCC meeting Sept. 3rd. Community Health Assessment Report will be going to marketing by Friday. The Ad Hoc committee has reviewed all of the data thus it now going to marketing for production in to a "booklet form". It is a very data based assessment that will give us good information to work with.</p>	
<p>Arts, Recreational, and Cultural Opportunities</p>	<p>Been struggling with the leadership to keep it going. Recreation wise, we are working together to create trail connectors within the city. We are waiting on news from the DNR as to whether the projects will be funded. The State conducted a walk through several weeks ago. Scott and Grant submitted a grant proposal through the community foundation. We have \$50,000 from Weatherwax. We have previously received</p>	<p>At the overall level still struggling with our action teams but we are moving forward with trails initiatives. Grant and Scott attended 2 meetings- Iron Belle Trail (meeting in Detroit with MDNR and other agencies). Iron Belle trail - one of the routes is biking and the other hiking. See the hand out provided. Part of the hiking trial is part of the Northern Route trail which is the longest in the country. We also attended local trail meeting in Blackman to discuss the Lake to Lake trail that use the Falling Waters trail sections and also we discussed how we can make connectors to Lakeland Trail head north east of the City of Jackson. I-94 will be a challenge to make the connections through that area. Also we discussed how to best to move forward to connect the Concord trail head on the Falling Waters Trail to the western border of Jackson County at the Calhoun border.</p>	

Education	The C2C has been approved as one of the Lumina Foundation’s 75 national partners. This will result in a grant of \$110,000 over 18 months. This also includes access to their training and resources.	Jackson is a partner with Lumina Foundation. They are focused on low income African Americans and White students and educational needs. Her Board will hopefully send 3 people to attend a 3 day workshop hosted by Lumina. They should know if they can attend by Sept. 1. They will look learn from other communities on how best to serve the public. They are looking at other grants too. Michigan College Access Network will help getting facilitators to help making connections between high school and post-secondary education issues.
