



Pleasant Lake County Park & Campground

This 21 acre park has 60 modern campsites with water and either 30 amp or 50 amp electricity at every site, restrooms, hot showers, a sanitary dump station and water tower. In the park you will find a swimming area, picnic areas and three picnic shelters (by reservation), fishing, playground, Frisbee golf, shuffle board, horseshoe pit, basketball court and room to ride bikes. An 18-hole golf course is nearby within 1/2 mile of campground.

PLEASANT LAKE CAMPGROUND RULES

- In case of emergency dial 911
- Check-out time is 11 a.m., Check-in 1 p.m.
- Beach hours daylight only
- Quiet time is 10 p.m. - 8 a.m. Children must be on their campsite at dark
- No refunds due to bad weather
- Occupancy limited to one family (two adults and immediate children) to one campsite; or, up to four adults. Only one camper and tent OR two tents maximum to occupy one campsite. Each vehicle must be registered on the written permit. 1 vehicle per site.
- No Fireworks or illegal drugs.
- Fires are permitted only in fire pits and grills. Collecting firewood is prohibited, wood for sale at camp office. Do not leave fire unattended.
- Discard garbage at designated areas.
- Gray water must be disposed of at dump station.
- Campers are not permitted to camp for more than 10 consecutive nights. A new camping permit can be issued after 24 hours has elapsed from the previous permit.

All rules are subject to change at any time for the protection of the campground. Choosing to violate any of Jackson County Parks' rules may result in eviction and/or prosecution.



PLEASANT LAKE CAMPGROUND RULES

- Do not set up campers/tents until a campsite is assigned and fees are paid.
- Park hours 7 a.m. – Sunset
- Visitors must park in day use parking area and leave by 10 p.m.
- Alcohol is ONLY allowed at registered campsite by registered campers who are at least 21 years old.
- Anyone camping under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult.
- One picnic table per site.
- No unauthorized motorized devices without the written consent of the parks department. Except motorized devices designed for, and used to, provide disabled persons with access to a facility.
- Water outlets at campsites are available to obtain water for campsites. Washing of vehicles, dishes, clothes, pets or person at these outlets or in the sinks in service buildings is prohibited.
- Domestic pets and service animals are welcome. Pets must be on lease no more than six feet in length. You are responsible for cleaning up after your pets, keeping your pets from disturbing wildlife, and keeping your pets from disturbing visitors.
- No person shall engage in any violent, abusive, boisterous, loud, illegal, obscene or similar disorderly conduct which unreasonably interferes with another person's use or enjoyment of a facility. Radios, generators, or other amplified devices may not be used in a manner that creates excessive noise.
